Brick Schools 2021-2022 School Year Essential Information

Levels PreK-12, All Students, & All Programs.
- **Breakfast will be provided** in all schools at all levels PreK-12 each morning and is free for all students.
- **Lunch, hot & cold, will be provided** at all levels PreK-12 and is free for all students.
- **Social Distancing and cohorting** of students will be followed **to the greatest extent practicable.**
- **Cleaning, Disinfecting, & Hygiene protocols will continue to be implemented.**
- **Mask wearing within the parameters of Executive Order #251.**



Brick Schools 2021-2022 School Year Health Screenings

Screening is an important component of keeping our learning environment Healthy & Safe. Our school community will continue to work together to keep all members of our school community Healthy & Safe.

During Designated “High Risk” periods per COVID-19 Regional High Risk Matrix:

- All Students & Staff will have a temperature check upon entering their school or office utilizing thermoscan thermometers and temperature kiosks.

Personal Responsibility Back-To-School Form

- **All Parents** will be asked to certify, through completion of a one time online form, that they will monitor their student's health daily and keep their student home when they are ill. **This form will be made available in Parent Portal.**
- **All Staff** will be asked to certify, **through completion of a one time online form**, that they will monitor their own health daily and stay home when they are ill.



Transportation

- Hand Sanitizer will be provided upon boarding the bus.
- Windows will remain open to a safe and appropriate point, weather permitting.
- Each bus will be equipped with signage regarding safe protocols and practices.
- Mask wearing on the Bus will take place within the parameters of Executive Order #251. (see slide 10)
- Parents have the option to Drop-Off and Pick-Up their student(s).
- Parent Drop-Off and Pick-Up times and procedures will be provided by each building Principal and have been developed in the best interest of safety for our students and learning communities as a whole.



BEST Program

- Students will be able to attend Before & Aftercare programs as regularly scheduled.

- Please contact the Building Principal if you have any questions.




Health & Safety

Masks will be broadly required in school buildings for the coming school year at this time.

Exceptions include:


- Excessive Heat impacting indoors
- Health/Medical Condition or Disability (IEP, 504, IHP)
- Engaged in Activity that cannot be performed wearing a mask: Eating, Drinking, Playing an Instrument
- Engaged in high-intensity aerobic or anaerobic activity
- Participating in high-intensity physical activities during PE Class
- Emergent medical condition circumstances
- Wearing a mask creates an unsafe condition to execute a task.

Masking of Student, Staff, Parents & Visitors will be in accordance per the Governor's Executive Order #251.

Mask Wearing by Students Redefines Close Contact & Lessens Quarantines

NJDOE Road Forward Update Guidance * Updated 8/20/21

In Classroom Settings, Exposed Students Wearing Masks Will No Longer be Considered a “Close Contact” and Will Not Be Subject to Quarantine

Updated NJDOE Road Forward Guidance, Aug. 20, 2021:

In the K–12 indoor classroom setting, **if both the infected student and the exposed student(s) are wearing well-fitting masks the entire time they were within 3-6 feet of each other**, the exposed student:

- Will NO LONGER BE CONSIDERED A CLOSE CONTACT and, therefore,
- Will NO LONGER BE SUBJECT TO QUARANTINE RESTRICTIONS.

This exception **does NOT apply to teachers, staff, or other adults** in the indoor classroom setting.

Social Distancing

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

To the extent practicable:

- ❑ BTPS schools will provide for social distancing within the schools to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Student grade level cohorts at the Elementary and Middle School Level will be maintained to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Entry & Exit locations will be monitored to reduce commingling interaction of students between classes to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Hall traffic and stairwell traffic will be designed to reduce commingling interaction of students between classes to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Signage will be utilized in all BTPS schools, buses, offices, and facilities to promote safe practices.

Handwashing & Respiratory Etiquette

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

Handwashing:

- ❑ Brick Schools will continue to maintain hand sanitizing stations with alcohol-based hand sanitizers (at least 60% alcohol) and/or Hand Washing Stations with soap and water:
 - ❑ In each classroom (PreK-12)
 - ❑ At entrances and exits of buildings.
 - ❑ Near lunchrooms and toilets.
- ❑ Continued Scheduled Handwashing, where & when applicable: Start of the Day, Before Eating and After Eating, Utilizing Playground/PE Equipment, Before and After using the Bathroom, After Blowing their Nose, Coughing, and/or Sneezing, Transitions.

Respiratory Etiquette:

- ❑ Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing.
- ❑ Use in the nearest waste receptacle to dispose of the tissue after use.
- ❑ Perform hand hygiene (e.g., hand washing with non-antimicrobial soap and water, alcohol-based hand rub, or antiseptic handwash) after having contact with respiratory secretions and contaminated objects/materials.

Facilities

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

Ventilation:

- ❑ **Windows and doors will be opened for ventilation.** Additionally, where deemed appropriate, we will use **hydroxyl generators, negative pressure machines or pedestal fans to promote air flow.**
- ❑ Classrooms without AC will also be supplied with **Air Purifiers with Hepa Filters.**
- ❑ Windows will be opened on buses within safety guidelines and in accordance with weather conditions.
- ❑ **Increased Filter inspection, cleaning, and changing.**
- ❑ **AC, where available, will be in use** in accordance with guidance from the CDC, NJDOH, & OCHD.

Cleaning:

- ❑ Facilities staff will follow **cleaning procedures for maintaining a healthy environment.** **Multi-Step/Multi-Level Procedures** have been developed and will be employed when needed and as required.
- ❑ Continued implementation of protocols for cleaning a BTPS facility &/or transportation vehicle after a person is identified as positive with COVID-19 in accordance with guidance from the CDC.

NOTE: ESSER II and ARP funds have been designated to upgrade aging ventilation systems in BTPS facilities and to provide for installing AC in specified facilities.

Symptomatic Students & Staff

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

- ❑ During periods of “High Risk” (as indicated on the COVID-19 Regional Risk Matrix) Students and Staff will have a temperature check upon entering their school or office utilizing thermoscan thermometers and/or temperature kiosks.
- ❑ Students & Staff who have a temperature greater than 100 degrees and/or respond yes to 2 or more screening questions will be sent home and referred to a healthcare provider for evaluation and COVID testing as needed.
- ❑ Students or Staff who are COVID-19 Positive or are a Close Contact will need to adhere to NJDOH COVID-19 Exclusion Criteria and Quarantine time periods.

COVID-19 Compatible Symptoms

Definition of COVID-19 Compatible Symptoms:

Parents should not send students to school when sick. Staff members should not attend school when sick. For school settings, NJDOH recommends that students or staff with the following symptoms be promptly isolated from others and excluded from school:

At least two of the following symptoms:

fever (measure or subjective),
chills, rigors (shivers),
myalgia (muscle aches),
headache,
sore throat,
nausea or vomiting,
diarrhea,
fatigue,
congestion,
or runny nose;

OR At least one of the following symptoms:

cough,
shortness of breath,
difficulty breathing,
new olfactory disorder (loss of smell),
or new taste disorder (loss of taste).

Contact Tracing

BTPS District Planning Team in coordination with Building Level Teams, District Nurse Coordinator, and in accordance with guidance from the CDC, NJDOH, and OCHD will continue to implement procedures and protocols to assist the local DOH with Contact Tracing.

- ❑ In the event that a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19 we will work with the Ocean County Health Department to determine and implement the required Contact Tracing.
- ❑ Parents are asked to contact their school Principal if their student tests positive for COVID-19 or is a close contact with a COVID-19 individual.
- ❑ Staff is asked to contact their Principal &/or their Immediate Supervisor if they test positive for COVID-19 or have come in close contact with a COVID-19 individual.
- ❑ Brick Schools will utilize seating charts to determine impacted individuals.
- ❑ When someone is identified as a close contact, they can choose to disclose if they are vaccinated, so the district can determine next steps.
- ❑ **Vaccination Status Impact on Quarantine Requirements** - Current Guidance:
 - ❑ **Vaccinated Individuals & those who have recovered from COVID-19 within the past 90 days DO NOT NEED TO QUARANTINE**, regardless of Activity Level.
 - ❑ **Unvaccinated Individuals must quarantine** in accordance with the COVID-19 Regional Risk Matrix Activity Level Requirements for quarantine.

Quarantine Requirements

| Low Risk | Moderate Risk | High Risk | Very High Risk |

| <i>14 days is always preferred as the best way to prevent COVID-19 transmission.</i> | | | |
| 10 days without testing OR 7 days with negative test results collected at 5-7 days | 10 days without testing OR 7 days with negative test results collected at 5-7 days | 14 days for individuals in group settings and organized activities | 14 days for individuals in group settings and organized activities |

Unvaccinated: Quarantine requirements for unvaccinated individuals vary depending on the COVID-19 Regional Risk Matrix from the NJDOH:

Low Risk: 10 Days without testing or 7 Days with a Negative Test Result COLLECTED at 5-7 Days

Moderate Risk: 10 Days without testing or 7 Days with a Negative Test Result COLLECTED at 5-7 Days

High Risk: 14 Days

Vaccinated: Quarantine requirements for fully vaccinated individuals who have NO COVID-19 like symptoms per the current guidance from the NJDOH:

- **Do not need to quarantine, be excluded from school, or be tested following an exposure** to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19.
- **Should still monitor for symptoms of COVID-19** for 14 days following an exposure.
- If they experience symptoms, they should isolate themselves from others, be clinically evaluated for COVID-19, including SARS-CoV-2 testing and inform their health care provider of their vaccination status at the time of presentation.

Vaccinations

Brick Schools has partnered with the OCHD, Ocean Medical Center in Brick, Integrity Health and other partners to provide vaccination information and opportunities to staff and to parents of eligible students.

7 Blended Learning Principles
“Student Centered, Teacher Led”

1. Establish and develop strong **relationships**
2. Focus on the **social and emotional needs** of students with an emphasis on wellness
3. Streamline and prioritize content that is **rigorous**, relevant and engaging
4. Use **technology** to enhance learning experiences by **communicating, collaborating, and creating**
5. Develop consistent, predictable **routines** for learner, parent, and teacher
6. **Communicate with families** in a clear, concise, and transparent manner
7. Dedicate **collaborative planning time** for staff

PreK-12

*Students will be in-person, full day,
5 days per week for the 2021-2022 School Year*

There will be NO Full Remote/Virtual Learning Option

Per Governor Murphy: “All students will be back in school for full-time in-person instruction for the 2021-2022 school year. **Full time remote learning option for families will be removed.**”

- Districts are required to offer “Homebound” Instruction for only medically necessary cases. **NOTE:** Homebound Instruction is NOT Quarantine Instruction. Please see Slides 23 and 24 for Quarantine Instruction Model.
- Homebound instruction features 5 hours of instruction (10 hours for special education students).
- Parents would fill out a Homebound Request Form and submit documentation from a physician. Our district physician reviews the request and approved students will be treated as ‘homebound’ students.
- Students are re-evaluated every 30 days and must re-certify the medical need for this homebound instruction.

STUDENTS WHO QUALIFY FOR QUARANTINE INSTRUCTION

- Student who tests positive for COVID-19 (with verification)
- Student who is considered a Close Contact of a COVID-19 Positive Individual, and is placed on quarantine by the district as a result of district contact tracing.
- Student with COVID-19 compatible symptoms and a verified doctor's note detailing symptoms.

Quarantine Instructional Model

- All Brick Schools teachers will maintain a Google Classroom for posting work and assignments.
- Quarantined students will work independently from home during the school day to complete the posted work.
- Quarantined students will be provided with virtual instructional support as follows:
 - Opportunity for up to one hour of virtual instructional support per day (two hours per day for special education), outside of the regular classroom time.
 - Instruction will be provided, when possible by the student's teacher(s).
 - Students in the same class &/or grade level will be provided instructional support together.
- Should the need arise for an entire class to be quarantined, instruction will take place virtually during the regularly scheduled school day.

Orientations, Back to School Nights, and Conferences

- **Orientations and Back to School Nights will be in-person.** Communication regarding specific times, protocols, and procedures will come from each school's Principal.
- Key information shared at Orientation and Back to School Nights will be made available via the school website and/or teacher posts to their classroom page.
- Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for November. **Parents will have the option to attend the conference in person or via Google Meet.**

Food Services

 - ❑ **Breakfast** will be **delivered to the classroom** daily at the **elementary and middle schools**. The **high school students** will come into the **cafeteria and choose their breakfast and then go to class**.
 - ❑ **Lunch** will be served in the cafeteria. Students will come through the serving line and eat in the cafeteria or other designated areas.
- ❑ All students will receive FREE meals per NSLP. (National School Lunch Program)
- ❑ We will follow all CDC and Board of Health Guidelines for all meal services.
