Personal Responsibility Back-To-School Form

NOTE: Parents are reminded to keep their student home if they are sick &/or have been exposed to a COVID-19 individual in accordance with the guidance from the NDOH & LDOH.

- **All Parents** will be asked to certify, through completion of a one time online form, that they will monitor their student's health daily and keep their student home when they are ill. **This form will be made available in Parent Portal.**

NOTE: Staff is reminded to stay home if they are sick &/or have been exposed to a COVID-19 individual in accordance with the guidance from the NDOH & LDOH.

- **All Staff** will be asked to certify, **through completion of a one time online form**, that they will monitor their own health daily and stay home when they are ill.



Transportation

- Hand Sanitizer will be provided upon boarding the bus.
- Windows will remain open to a safe and appropriate point, weather permitting.
- Each bus will be equipped with signage regarding safe protocols and practices.
- Mask wearing on the Bus will be optional as of March 7, 2022.
- Parents have the option to Drop-Off and Pick-Up their student(s).
- Parent Drop-Off and Pick-Up times and procedures will be provided by each building Principal and have been developed in the best interest of safety for our students and learning communities as a whole.

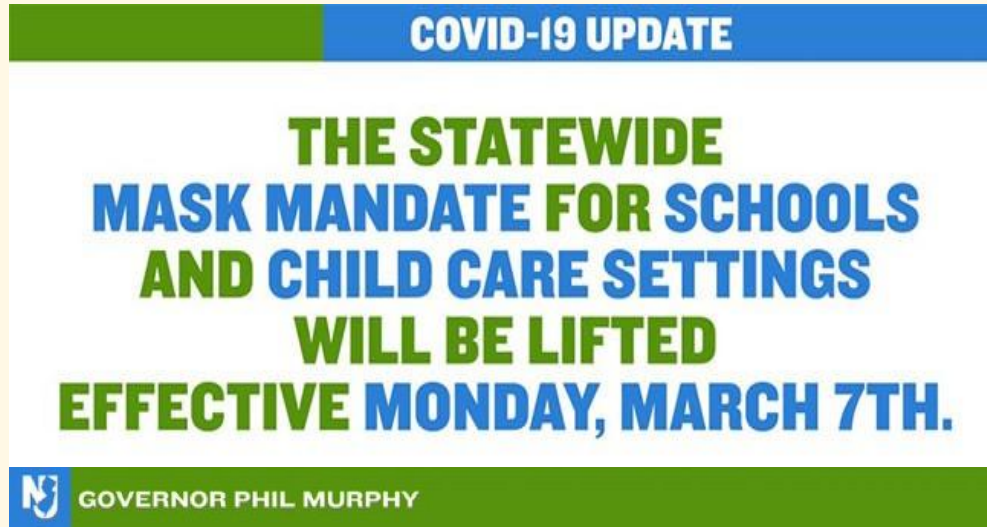
Brick Schools 2021-2022 School Visitors

- **Visitors** will be **allowed** into the schools for **essential school related business** which includes, but is not limited to: Back to School Night, Parent Teacher Conferences, 504 Meetings, I&RS Meetings, Meetings with Teachers &/or Counselors, IEP Meetings. Other school related activities will be determined on a school by school basis and communicated by the building principal.
- Mask wearing is optional as of March 7, 2022.

Health & Safety

**Masking of Student, Staff, Parents & Visitors
will be optional in all Brick Township Public Schools and
on Brick Township Public School Buses as of March 7, 2022.**



The District shall continue to take all actions necessary to ensure the safety and well being of all students and staff. It is so important that we continue to practice tolerance and consideration for others as we implement this new change. Additionally, it is essential that we all work together with understanding and empathy to promote an environment where everyone can feel comfortable with their choice.

Social Distancing

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

To the extent practicable:

- ❑ BTPS schools will provide for social distancing within the schools to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Student grade level cohorts at the Elementary and Middle School Level will be maintained to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Entry & Exit locations will be monitored to reduce commingling interaction of students between classes to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Hall traffic and stairwell traffic will be designed to reduce commingling interaction of students between classes to the maximum extent practicable.
- ❑ Signage will be utilized in all BTPS schools, buses, offices, and facilities to promote safe practices.

Handwashing & Respiratory Etiquette

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

Handwashing:

- ❑ Brick Schools will continue to maintain hand sanitizing stations with alcohol-based hand sanitizers (at least 60% alcohol) and/or Hand Washing Stations with soap and water:
 - ❑ In each classroom (PreK-12)
 - ❑ At entrances and exits of buildings.
 - ❑ Near lunchrooms and toilets.
- ❑ Continued Scheduled Handwashing, where & when applicable: Start of the Day, Before Eating and After Eating, Utilizing Playground/PE Equipment, Before and After using the Bathroom, After Blowing their Nose, Coughing, and/or Sneezing, Transitions.

Respiratory Etiquette:

- ❑ Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing.
- ❑ Use in the nearest waste receptacle to dispose of the tissue after use.
- ❑ Perform hand hygiene (e.g., hand washing with non-antimicrobial soap and water, alcohol-based hand rub, or antiseptic handwash) after having contact with respiratory secretions and contaminated objects/materials.

Facilities

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

Ventilation:

- ❑ **Windows and doors will be opened for ventilation.** Additionally, where deemed appropriate, we will use **hydroxyl generators, negative pressure machines or pedestal fans to promote air flow.**
- ❑ Classrooms without AC will also be supplied with **Air Purifiers with Hepa Filters.**
- ❑ Windows will be opened on buses within safety guidelines and in accordance with weather conditions.
- ❑ **Increased Filter inspection, cleaning, and changing.**
- ❑ **AC, where available, will be in use** in accordance with guidance from the CDC, NJDOH, & OCHD.

Cleaning:

- ❑ Facilities staff will follow **cleaning procedures for maintaining a healthy environment.** **Multi-Step/Multi-Level Procedures** have been developed and will be employed when needed and as required.
- ❑ Continued implementation of protocols for cleaning a BTPS facility &/or transportation vehicle after a person is identified as positive with COVID-19 in accordance with guidance from the CDC.

NOTE: ESSER II and ARP funds have been designated to upgrade aging ventilation systems in BTPS facilities and to provide for installing AC in specified facilities.

Symptomatic Students & Staff

Health & Safety protocols and procedures will be implemented in each of the BTPS facilities in accordance with the Governor's Executive Orders and Announcements and guidance from the NJDOE, NJDOH, and OCHD.

- ❑ Students & Staff who have a temperature greater than 100 degrees and/or respond yes to 2 or more screening questions will be sent home and referred to a healthcare provider for evaluation and COVID testing as needed.
- ❑ Students or Staff who are COVID-19 Positive or who meet the criteria for Close Contact will need to adhere to NJDOH COVID-19 Exclusion Criteria and Quarantine time periods.

COVID-19 Compatible Symptoms

Definition of COVID-19 Compatible Symptoms:

Parents should not send students to school when sick. Staff members should not attend school when sick. For school settings, NJDOH recommends that students or staff with the following symptoms be promptly isolated from others and excluded from school:

At least two of the following symptoms:

fever (measure or subjective),
chills, rigors (shivers),
myalgia (muscle aches),
headache,
sore throat,
nausea or vomiting,
diarrhea,
fatigue,
congestion,
or runny nose;

OR At least one of the following symptoms:

cough,
shortness of breath,
difficulty breathing,
new olfactory disorder (loss of smell),
or new taste disorder (loss of taste).

Contact Tracing

BTPS District Planning Team in coordination with Building Level Teams, District Nurse Coordinator, and in accordance with guidance from the CDC, NJDOH, and OCHD will continue to implement procedures and protocols to assist the local DOH with Contact Tracing.

PLEASE DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL or COME TO WORK WITH COVID SYMPTOMS OR IF YOU ARE SICK.

- ❑ Parents are asked to contact their school Principal if their student tests positive for COVID-19 or is a close contact with a COVID-19 individual.
- ❑ Staff is asked to contact their Principal &/or their Immediate Supervisor if they test positive for COVID-19 or have come in close contact with a COVID-19 individual.

UPDATE: Due to the decline of COVID-19 cases across NJ and within Brick Township Public Schools, the district will no longer require unvaccinated, asymptomatic students or staff to quarantine if they're determined to be "close contacts" of a COVID-19 case in school. This decision is being made as a direct result of an analysis of district-wide data regarding close contacts within our schools. Please know this will not impact unvaccinated, household close contacts, who will still be required to quarantine for 5 full days and may return on day 6. It is recommended for Close Contacts to be tested on day 5, however this is not required to return on day 6.

Close Contact - In School - Unvaccinated Quarantine Timeframes

- Asymptomatic close contact will not be required to quarantine, regardless of vaccination status.
- If close contact develops symptoms they need to get tested and follow isolation timeframes if positive.



Updated Isolation & Quarantine Timeframes - COVID19 - NJDOH - February 2022



COVID Positive Individuals: Vaccinated or Unvaccinated - 5 Day Isolation

SYMPTOMATIC

- **Isolate for 5 full days** and **return to school or work on day 6** providing the individual is 24 hours fever free & other symptoms have improved.
- If symptoms persist, continue to isolate until 24 hours fever free, and then the individual may return to school or work.

NON-SYMPTOMATIC

- **Isolate for 5 full days and return to school or work on day 6.**
- **If symptoms develop** within one week (5 days) of the positive test, the **5 day isolation period starts over at day 0 counting from the first day of symptoms.** The individual must then **isolate for an additional 5 full days and may return to school or work on day 6 of the second isolation period providing they are 24 hours fever free & other symptoms have improved.**

NOTE: Symptomatic or Non-Symptomatic should wear a mask at all times from day 6-10 when around others.

Close Contact - Outside of School - Unvaccinated Quarantine Timeframes

- Close contact must quarantine for 5 full days and may return on day 6. It is recommended for Close Contacts to be tested on day 5, however this is not required to return on day 6.
- If close contact develops symptoms they need to get tested and follow isolation timeframes if positive.

Close Contact - Outside of School & In-School - Vaccinated Quarantine Timeframes

- **The following groups DO NOT NEED TO QUARANTINE or be excluded from school, or be tested following an exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19.**
 - Adults 18 years or older who are completely vaccinated; this includes the booster shot.
 - Children 5-17 who are fully vaccinated. (*This does NOT include the booster shot.)
 - Persons who had confirmed COVID-19 within the last 90 days. (Laboratory Confirmed PCR test)
- If they experience symptoms, they need to get tested and follow isolation timeframes if positive.

Vaccinations

Brick Schools has partnered with the OCHD, Ocean Medical Center in Brick, Integrity Health and other partners to provide vaccination information and opportunities to staff and to parents of eligible students.

"Student Centered, Teacher Led"

1. Establish and develop strong **relationships**
2. Focus on the **social and emotional needs** of students with an emphasis on wellness
3. Streamline and prioritize content that is **rigorous**, relevant and engaging
4. Use **technology** to enhance learning experiences by **communicating, collaborating, and creating**
5. Develop consistent, predictable **routines** for learner, parent, and teacher
6. **Communicate with families** in a clear, concise, and transparent manner

*Students will be in-person, full day,
5 days per week for the 2021-2022 School Year*

There will be NO Full Remote/Virtual Learning Option

Per Governor Murphy: “All students will be back in school for full-time in-person instruction for the 2021-2022 school year. **Full time remote learning option for families will be removed.**”

- Districts are required to offer “Homebound” Instruction for only medically necessary cases. **NOTE:** Homebound Instruction is NOT Quarantine Instruction. Please see Slides 23 and 24 for Quarantine Instruction Model.
- Homebound instruction features 5 hours of instruction (10 hours for special education students).
- Parents would fill out a Homebound Request Form and submit documentation from a physician. Our district physician reviews the request and approved students will be treated as ‘homebound’ students.
- Students are re-evaluated every 30 days and must recertify the medical need for this homebound instruction.

INSTRUCTING QUARANTINED STUDENTS Quarantine Instructional Model

Brick Schools "Window into the Classroom" Quarantine Instructional Model provides a student an opportunity to peer inside the classroom through a webcam that is focused on the primary point of instruction.

Parameters for Brick Schools Quarantine Instructional Model:

- All Teachers will post assignments and presentations in Google Classroom at ALL Levels and for ALL Instructional Areas.
- Students will have the number of days they are absent to complete assignments.
- Students will not be penalized if they do not attend via the "Window into the Classroom".
- A student's attendance will not be penalized while on quarantine.

Eligibility for Quarantine Instructional Model:

- Student who tests positive for COVID-19 (with verification)
- Student with COVID-19 compatible symptoms and a verified doctor's note detailing symptoms.
- Student who is considered a Close Contact of a COVID-19 Positive Individual and whose close contact status is verified by the school nurse.

INSTRUCTING QUARANTINED STUDENTS Quarantine Instructional Model

• High School Level

- o All classes, with the exception of PE, will implement the "Window into the Classroom Model" and teachers will provide a google link to each student who is quarantined.
- o There is no expectation for engagement.
- o PE will not have a "Window into the Classroom" since students will be engaged in physical activity. Teachers will post an overview of instruction and activity for the week.
- o Students in ICR, POR, LLD, & BD Programs will follow this model. Teachers of MD and Autism Programs will reach out to the parent of the quarantined student for the Quarantined Model of Instruction.

• Middle School Level

- o Teachers in core academic classes and EXCEL will implement the "Window into the Classroom Model" and teachers will provide a google link to each student who is quarantined.
- o There is no expectation for engagement
- o PE and Elective will not have a "Window into the Classroom Model". Teachers will post an overview of instruction and activity for that week in Google Classroom.
- o Students in ICR, POR, LLD, & BD Programs will follow this model. Teachers of MD and Autism Programs will reach out to the parent of the quarantined student for the Quarantined Model of Instruction.

Quarantine Instructional Model

- **Elementary School Level**

- Classroom teachers will post a schedule for "Window into the Classroom Model" for Reading, Writing, Math, Science, SS during direct instruction and will provide a google link to each student who is quarantined.
- PE and Elective areas will not have a "Window into the Classroom Model". Teachers will post an overview of the instruction and activity for the week in Google Classroom.
- Students in ICR, POR, LLD, & BD Programs will follow this model. Teachers of MD and Autism Programs will reach out to the parent of the quarantined student for the Quarantined Model of Instruction.

- **Preschool Level**

- Classroom teachers will post a schedule for "Window into the Classroom Model" during Story Lab time and will provide a google link to each student who is quarantined.
- Related services will be provided via Google Meet.

Orientations, Back to School Nights, and Conferences

- **Orientations and Back to School Nights will be in-person.** Communication regarding specific times, protocols, and procedures will come from each school's Principal.
- Key information shared at Orientation and Back to School Nights will be made available via the school website and/or teacher posts to their classroom page.
- Parent/Teacher Conferences are scheduled for November. **Parents will have the option to attend the conference in person or via Google Meet.**

 - ❑ **Breakfast** will be **delivered to the classroom** daily at the **elementary and middle schools**. The **high school students** will come into the **cafeteria and choose their breakfast and then go to class**.
 - ❑ **Lunch** will be served in the cafeteria. Students will come through the serving line and eat in the cafeteria or other designated areas.
- ❑ All students will receive FREE meals per NSLP. (National School Lunch Program)
- ❑ We will follow all CDC and Board of Health Guidelines for all meal services.

 - ❑ **Preschool:** Chromebooks or iPads (as needed)
